AUDIOVISUAL ARTS FESTIVAL AT THE ATHENS CONCERT HALL (MEGARON)

The Department of Audio & Visual Arts and the Electroacoustic Music Research and Applications Laboratory (EPHMEE) of the Department of Music Studies will present the 11th Audiovisual Arts Festival at the Athens Concert Hall (Megaron) on 20th and 21st of May 2017. The Festival, held every year since 2006, has become a meeting point for the audiovisual arts in the digital age.

The two-day event includes a dense program of exhibitions, screenings, concerts, workshops, lectures and masterclasses. The Department of Audio & Visual Arts will present its course over the time retrospectively in a digital art show by exhibiting selected works of graduate, postgraduate and PhD students and professors. At the same time, the event will host works by the internationally renowned artists Eija-LiisaAhtila, Barry Purves and Theodore Ushev. The program is complemented by including in it workshops, masterclasses and lectures by prominent guests with a focus on the art, technology and aesthetics of video art and animation (*Art & Digital Culture*).

The **exhibition** will show interactive audio-visual installations, animation and video art works, projection mappings, acoustic environments, interactive and audio games, comic and photography exhibitions.

The **workshops** will be open to the public and will focus on 2D & 3D animation, the interactive audio-visual platforms, projection mapping and research on digital hybrid materials.

In the **masterclass and lectures programme,** the renowned visual artist, Eija-Liisa Ahtila, will be our honorary guest who will introduce the audience to the relation of her work with film in the era of digital technology. The celebrated animators, Barry Purves and Theodore Ushev, invited in collaboration with BE THERE! Corfu Animation Festival, will analyze their art, their techniques and their approach to technology. Dan Lejerskar, EON-Reality Chairman, will talk about "The Evolution of the Augmented

Reality Market & the Human - Computer - Interaction Problem" and Professor Nikolaos Kanellopoulos will make a presentation on "From Antikythera Mechanism to Quantum Computer: Augmented Reality and Art". The director of BE THERE! and PhD student of the Department, Vassilis Kroustallis, will focus on the relation of animation to politics and Dr. Michael Meimaris will talk about "Human[e]ducation for a "good enough" screen".

The Electroacoustic Music Research and Applications Laboratory (EPHMEE) will present electroacoustic music concerts in a specially designed multichannel sound diffusion system that offers the -audience a unique listening experience. The program, under the title "ACOUSMATA 2017", includes five concerts with works by composers of Electroacoustic Music. Volkmar Klein and Thomas Gorbach will be the guest of these concerts.

The two-day event is a joint production of the Faculty of Music and Audiovisual Arts of the Ionian University and the Athens Concert Hall, in the framework of *Megaron Bridges Cycle* and in collaboration with Animasyros Festival and BETHERE! Corfu Animation Festival.

The Faculty of Music & Audiovisual Arts (founded in 2013) of the Ionian University consists of the Department of Audio & Visual Arts and the Department of Music Studies. The Department of Audio & Visual Arts (founded in 2004) provides both undergraduate and postgraduate studies for New Media artists reseachers. The Department of Music Studies (1992) offers a study programme with focus on professional composers, performers, music teachers and music technicians.

The **Electroacoustic Music Research and Applications Laboratory** (EPHMEE, founded in 2003) of the Department of Music Studies is a research unit which supports the Music Technology program of the Department of Music Studies. The EPHMEE produces original work in the wider fields of Music and Audio Art with the use of electronic technology. **Eija-Liisa Ahtila** is one of the most celebrated visual artists and filmmakers. Ahtila has herself described her work as "human dramas". Her work focuses on existential issues and film language, and more recently, on more profound theoretical and philosophical issues, concerning human existence and culture. Among others, her work has been shown in individual and retrospective exhibitions in Tate Modern, in MoMA, in Guggenheim, in Bilbao, in Jeu de Paume, in Neue Nationalgalerie in Berlin, in Kiasma in Helsinki, in Moderna Museet in Stockholm, while she has participated in influential group shows, such as Venice Biennale.

His published work includes three international patents and about 100 papers/studies. Currently his main research interest is in the application of digital technology in audiovisual art interactive systems (VR/AR).
